ANNUAL COMMUNITY THANKSGIVING DINNER


The Annual Community Thanksgiving Day Dinner, will take place on November 24th, 2022 from noon to 3:00pm. This event is sponsored by the congregations of the Delhi Clergy Association and is hosted this year by Delhi Alliance Church.

Dinner will be in person at the Delhi Fire Hall. Dinners will also be available for pick-up by reservation with a deadline of November 16th. Freewill offerings will be accepted.



The Deacons will again be coordinating gifts from our church for the Delhi Children's Christmas Fund. This year we will aim to provide gifts for 20 children. 

*In the event of rain, the Living Nativity will not be held.






