HEALTH AND PEACE IN THE NEW YEAR

What are relationships based on and how do they work well?

This is a question you might hear in a pre-marital counseling session, or from someone you've invited in to help with your own marriage. But it is really important to remember that a church congregation is built on relationships as well. The New Testament affirms this very thing, and St Paul is a great relationship coach in his letters to the various Christian congregations in his day.

Even churches can exhibit relational issues, because the church is a group of human beings, not one of whom is perfect and/or your favorite person ever. That's why grace is so important, and grace doesn't always happen easily; one needs to intentionally seek to develop a gracious spirit towards others.

As an imperfect human being in an imperfect congregation we need to learn to form new habits; healthy habits, so that our common life is pleasing for us and pleasing to the Lord. Communication is the number one stumbling stone in marriages. I know this from my pastoral counseling years, and guiding a congregation to congregational health is a priority.

In light of this, the Session is ready to offer two workshops from the organization formed for the purpose of leading congregations to improved health. The organization is simply named "Healthy Congregations" and there are people within our Presbytery that have been trained as facilitators.

Our dates for 2 workshops are tentative until confirmed by the facilitators who have already met with Session. The workshops include a video lesson and group discussions. Each of the 2 sessions, with more to come if desired, will last around 2 and a half hours. It is certainly a time commitment that can bring great results for any congregation.

Lighting the Way for Others

When Ida Nelson, head tribal clerk of a remote Alaskan village, heard an airplane flying low after dark, she knew something was wrong. Igiugig, population 70, isn't normally a nighttime destination. Indeed, the medevac flight was coming to pick up a sick child.

Because the local airstrip's lights had been vandalized, the plane was having trouble landing. Nelson began alerting neighbors, and within minutes, villagers lined the runway with their vehicles, headlights blazing. The pilot was able to land and then safely deliver the sick child to an Anchorage hospital. The airlift service praised the residents' determination, but Nelson describes their effort as "normal" and "ordinary."

What everyday actions can you use to provide light amid darkness? How can you shine Jesus' light in a world that needs him?

I hope that everyone had a wonderful holiday season!!






Follow the Star was a wonderful evening!




