Matthew 4:17 "From that time on Jesus began to preach, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near."

When John the Baptist was put into prison by Herod Antipas, Jesus withdrew from Nazareth, his home village, and moved to Capernaum. Many of his neighbors had rejected his message. His ministry had been accepted by many in Capernaum. So Jesus protected his ministry by relocating. His message was quite the same as his cousin John's, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near."

Though we often associate this phrase with a type of evangelical Christianity most Presbyterians do not identify with, it is the heart of Jesus's message. "Repent" is made up of words, one of which is a prefix and one of which is a verb. Remember English class and red marks? "Re" means to repeat or return or something like that. We have dozens of "re" words in English. "Pent" from the Latin and refers to a path or direction of travel. Literally it means to come home and start the trip over again on the right path. Figuratively, it means to restart (a "re" word itself) our life's journey.

Jesus came to change lives. He came to call people back to the path God had laid out for them. The Sermon on the Mount was Jesus's first chat outlining for people what God's path for our lives looks like. I am glad the chats are being well received because they are step one. How do we follow Christ's lead in life? He tells us.

I am finding that worship among you is amazing. Please continue to invite others you know, members who have not been here in a while, neighbors and friends and children and grandchildren. And on Wednesday, March 8 we will begin a series of 4 small group studies. They will be at 6 PM and followed by refreshments. Practice talking about the Bible and your walk with Jesus with friends. That is where you learn how to talk about your faith with others. We are his hands in this community and throughout the world. We need to be his voice in the wilderness as well.

One Great Hour of Sharing

Our March Mission Emphasis

During the month of March our church mission focus will be One Great Hour of Sharing which is a PCUSA mission. This mission addresses needs worldwide. The three programs supported by One Great Hour of Sharing - Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, the Presbyterian Hunger Program, and Self-Development of People - all work in different ways to serve individuals and communities in need. From initial disaster response to ongoing community development, their work fits together to provide people with safety, sustenance, and hope. Please consider supporting this mission.

In the month of April our mission will be focused on Church World Service hygiene kits. Betty Bell is currently working on assembling these kits. She is in need of wide-toothed combs, bars of soap (full-size) and Band-Aids $(3/4" \times 3")$ to complete the kits. If you are able to supply these, see Betty or drop them off at the church office. The church also needs financial support to ship these kits. We pay \$2.00/kit. These kits are given out to individuals and families all over the world when they have a need from disaster or poverty situations.



The next Bountiful Giving Sundays are March 26th and April 30th.

In February we raised \$2,199.50 through the Kirk and congregational giving for earthquake relief in Turkey. Thank you for your contributions!
