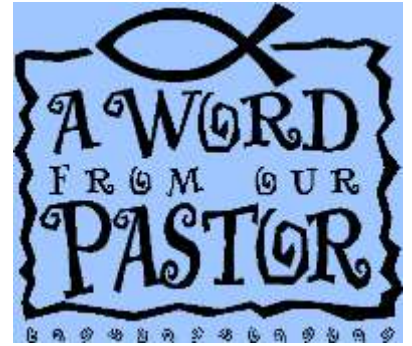

“For you know that it was not with perishable things such as silver or gold that you were redeemed from *the empty way of life handed down to you from your ancestors, but with the precious blood of Christ, a lamb without blemish or defect.” 1 Peter 1: 18-19**

The empty way of life. Many discover at some point that we have invested our lives in purposes that are good, but in time we outgrow them. We enter a new phase of life with experience, memories and wondering, “why do I get out of bed today?”

In 1976 Gail Sheehy wrote a book about this and called it *Passages, Predictable Crises of Adult Life*. I have been thinking about this book. I just lost a dear friend, Alec Sutherland. He was a brilliant, kind professor of English at Nazareth College in Rochester. He could have taught anywhere and had offers from “spiffier” schools, but he was more than content to be a colleague and mentor where he was.

I was talking to him 6 years ago, a few days after he had been told he had six months to live. Over coffee and conversation, he shared that his last unanswered question was about what comes next, if anything, after death. I reminded him that our job is to live well each day that we are given. God takes care of the rest, including the end.

A year later we were having conversation over coffee. He said, “My doctor said that my survival for a year is entirely unprecedented and that if he was a believer he would call this a miracle.”

I smiled and said, “It is a miracle whether or not your doctor believes it.”

He was very quiet, then said, "Yes, I know." He returned to our faith; his wife was baptized and joined Christ Church in Pittsford. On Saturday my wife and I gathered with others to say "Goodbye." It was a rich time. I must admit that as happy as I am for Alec, I wish I could have another cup of coffee with him.

For 5 more years Alec continued to love his former students as he had the opportunity and continued to explore the universe – mostly in books because he could no longer travel. Through all of life's moments, Alec lived two constants: adventure and giving others a hand up.

What are the constants of your life - the passions that do not change as the circumstances of your life do? What was there as you left home and started a new life, left a job and started a new one, embraced a life partner, said "Hi" to a child, said "Bye" to your last child, or lost a friend? God has given you a passion - maybe two or three. You have already lived that passion out in many situations. Your life will change and you will have to find new ways to live your passions. You find them or you become another of those who have outlived their lives and wonder why God does not just take them.

At the reception, my wife brought Alec's dear friend and college "Mother," Sister Monica, over. She hugged me and thanked me for encouraging Alec's faith for many years. She knew of the moment he looked at me and said, "I believe."

I am almost 80. My life is changing and it is a real pain. Sister Monica reminded me of what counts. I helped God lift a weight from the heart of a friend 6 years ago. God used our friendship as a part of releasing the power of Alec's love for the final years of his life. As his life was becoming increasingly circumscribed by a failing body, Alec was – perhaps – even wiser and more wonderful than before. As small as my contribution was, God was and is grateful that I came and had coffee.

If you pray daily the simple prayer, "What do you have for me today?" hush up and listen. God who is faithful will show you love in ways that fit your life today. He had a purpose for Alec up to the moment he moved a finger and touched the palm of his wife's hand then breathed his last. God has a purpose for you right up to the last moment of your life. Seek and you will find. Change is a pain. God is faithful.

Christian Education

Our apportionment is based on 163 members giving a total of \$7,163.85. The money is paid by our church to cover our share of basic operation costs of our Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly. Each member is invited to contribute \$43.95 to help pay this obligation.

- Scheduled our annual meeting with our Morgan Stanley agents to review the FPC investment profile for May 17th at 6:30 PM.
- Snow Blower has been serviced and repaired.
- Fellowship hall elevator has been serviced.
- Library has been set as the secure room for the church facility; other measures are being investigated throughout the facility.
- Manse maintenance: The trustees have had the bats removed from the attic, mold remediation completed throughout the manse and a state-of-the-art humidifier and UV light has been placed in the heat duct on the furnace.
- Regular FPC March and April 2023 bills have been approved to be paid.
- The mowing of the Flats Cemetery has been contracted for this summer.
- Deer fencing has been taken down and stored.
- Raking of leaves along the buildings has been completed.
