

"Woe to you who add house to house and join field to field till no space is left and you live alone in the land." Isaiah 5:8

For how long have people in cities "discovered the countryside" and spent good money buying up people's homes and making them showplaces? Well, Isaiah was protesting the way wealthy Egyptians, Phoenicians and Persians were buying up farms and homes in the hills of Judea. At the time of Christ the world was warmer than it is today. Therefore, some places we think of as dry had more rain. Parts of Judea looked like the Catskills. In the spring and the fall everything was in bloom and compared to most of the major cities it was relatively cool.

Because the Judean hills were so attractive, formerly "Average Joe homes" became hunting preserves and playgrounds for the rich. They had no interest in the neighborhoods, its people or its traditions. The families that had been in the hills for generations were struggling. Their new neighbors were not. That was 500 BC.

Does this all sound oddly familiar? As you shift your focus as members First Presbyterian Church of Delhi to its future, please keep in mind that just because many of the "new people" in the area have no interest in the local Rotary, local Volunteer Fire Department or the local First Presbyterian Church it does not mean we have no future as a church.

First, we have lived through the Civil War, the Panic of 1882, the Spanish-American War, the First World War, the Great Depression, the Second World War, the "Sexual Revolution" and on and on. We have always found a way forward. There is always a way forward. In God's love we have found a way forward in both adversity and in the times in which the culture was friendly towards us. We have solved problems and celebrate victories for a very long time.

Second, over 80% of the people who join a church do so because they have been invited. Your love for this place and its people and your love for God makes a difference. In the last few weeks, we have seen several more people who used to attend appear. That is just great! Keep on being excited and talking us up.

Third, we continue to make it easy to invite people in. If someone you know mentions they need pants invite them to the Kirk and mention the good we do for others with part of the money, like Elizabeth Nealis or Mohsin Elder. Get what you need and bless other people, that is a Wow. And the train ride coming up. Or our new small group on using meditation to overcome the toxic cocktail of anxiety, resentment and shame. Flyers are on the table in the New Narthex and in front of the Chapel.

Look, we cannot prevent New York City people from continuing to buy up farmland and we cannot keep successful city people from buying up houses and acreage. But we can continue to solve problems as they appear, invite people to participate in a concert or other special events and we can talk up the good we do here and around the world. We have always been "can do" people, so let's do.





Our Summer Mission Emphasis

The committee began a program of allocating \$100 a month each for Pakistan and Cambodian missions in May, with the money to come from Kirk proceeds. So far \$50 a month has been allocated to Mohsin Elder (Pakistan) to assist him in reaching out to other communities. Money for Cambodia through Bethel Ministries is being accumulated while we look for an appropriate project. Meanwhile the Kirk has accumulated 14 tubs of clothing which will be delivered to a Cambodian summer camp on July 7th. This material will be available for folks at the camp and distributed to other churches.

The last Friday of July FPC will have a baked goods table at Fair on the Square.

- Met with our Morgan Stanley agents to review the FPC investment profile.


