Welcome back to our new program year. In this edition of the Courier you will hear about lots of good stuff that is happening. The one that has absorbed much of my time and that of the Session has been getting set to start the Pulpit Nominating Committee. As you probably recall, we asked the Committee on Ministry (CoM) for assistance with healthy communications. They agreed to provide a team of trainers certified in the "Healthy Church" process. The trainers felt it was important to have an experienced pastor on board, so we waited for me to arrive. The moment that process was completed, we began to work on the Mission Study process, not just myself but your Session. They have been remarkable through this whole process.

I had lunch with the new Presbytery Executive, Greg Garis, in early June. He looked over the Church facility, checked out the manse basement and was delighted the attic was bat free. He liked what he saw and heard. He was also impressed with what he saw in the community. Unlike many rural communities, our two largest employers are both expanding. A Blue Bee lunch makes friends of people from places like Dallas, Texas. I mention this because a Presbytery's Executive is an important part of the PNC process. Though his endorsement does not guarantee success, a negative executive would be a show stopper. We are fortunate.

Since the MiF questions were in transition, Ed Furgol selected a tool called a S.W.O.T. Analysis. S.W.O.T. is commonly used for planning purposes for not-for-profits. The letters stand for Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats. We did a Town Hall Meeting at the end of June. The results are reported in the Newsletter [*subsequent page*]. We expect CoM's positive response to our Mission Study September 5.

Greg Garis and our CoM Representative Mark Montfort are expecting to be with us at our next Session Meeting. We meet on Monday, September 11. Things start moving forward after that, a Congregational Meeting to elect the PNC, the PNC completes our Mission Information Form, CoM approves us to start looking and off we go. I hope we are done before Thanksgiving, but all the stares will have to align.

We are in a stronger position to find a new full-time, installed pastor this time around than we were in the recent past. I am personally convinced that if the PNC can talk someone appropriate into coming and seeing the community and the church they will fall in love with you guys like Bessie and I have. Getting someone to look at us, however, will not be a snap.

Like Moses and the Hebrew Children, we are off into the wilderness of the hunt. It won't be 40 years. God will guide and protect us and provide what we need. Please keep myself, the Session and the Church in your prayers.

Summary of SWOT Analysis Conducted at FPC Delhi

Items listed from most to least support.

- 1. Great stuff about FPC Delhi: Mission (6), The Kirk (6), Music (3), Care for others (2)/Disaster response (2), Building maintenance, Family, Living Nativity, Scottish Festival/Bazaar, Welcoming.
- FPC could do better: Programs to families (4)/Youth outreach (4), Advertise services and programs in The Kirk (2), Communications with non-attending members and visitors (2), Information and training (for the latter training by presbytery) about the boards (2), Pastoral care (2), Welcoming visitors (2), Adult programs, Technology and use of space, Weekly communion.
- Why are we doing that: Locking front door (2), Too many people on governing boards (2) – that only requires a by-law change, Nothing (2), Should alter worship with more music, Collecting returnables, Less beggars, Living Nativity, No summer change in worship hours, Stoppage of worship services.
- 4. Should be doing: Community involvement (4), Bible study (3), Church collaboration (2), online presence (2), Advertise weekly in newspapers, Budget adjustment, Progressive dinner, Progressive worship service, Senior assistance, SUNY Delhi outreach.
- 5. Biggest headache: Too few members to staff programs and fund church (10), Budget, building maintenance, retaining pastor, personal evangelism, not changing, community leaders should evangelize.
- 6. Biggest opportunity: Community presence -- Zoom services for elderly/summer lawn worship (2), New pastor (2), Refugee/health impaired/neighbor impacted by disaster hosting (2), Better internet, Community collaboration, Housing, Recorded sermons, Ties with Bovina and other small churches.
- 7. What does Delhi need: Accepting the need for God (2), Safe place for social connections – especially for youth (2), The Kirk (2), Adopt a community disaster mission project, Churches cooperating, Fewer churches, Fewer Sunday activities – allowing people to attend church, Jobs and housing, Living Nativity, More stores and places of interest to attract people. Across rural America the two greatest needs are jobs and housing.


