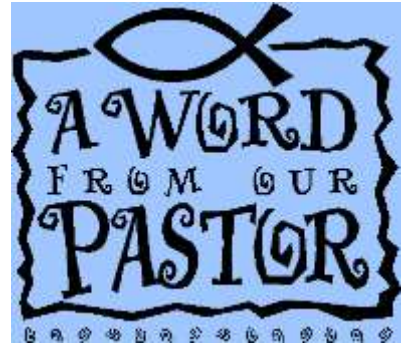

**“O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is thy name in all the earth! Thou whose glory above the heavens is chanted by the mouth of babes and infants, thou hast founded a bulwark because of thy foes, to still the enemy and the avenger.”**

**Psalm 8: 1-2 RSV**

David was sitting in the garden on the rooftop of his palace after dinner. The sun was going down, the moon was up and the stars were coming out. The gentle evening breeze had begun cleaning the air of the daytime heat and dust. He heard the sounds of women feeding their babies at their breasts and the sound of small children playing outside. Nightfall was a scaring time for him as a child. The predators came out looking for dinner. Sheep looked awfully nice. As he remembered and felt the contrast, he wrote a praise song. His instrument was the harp, not the guitar, but as has always been the case of those who see more than most, David had to sing.

I was watching a young mother blowing bubbles for her two “knee high to a grasshopper” children. Young children bounce, you know. The sun was shining and the light breeze was promising more flowers and walks and sitting outside. Such a simple picture, how natural. A young mother in the sunshine of Delhi with bouncing children and bubbles. I remember David and his song. Does that happen to you? I bet it does.

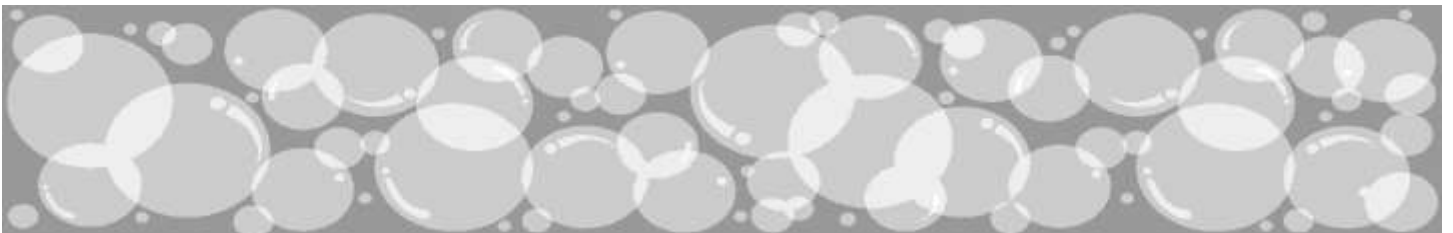
You know me. I just adore young children. Don't you? I got out of my chair and walked out to our back yard. I thanked the young mother for the gift of a beautiful moment. I do think we should do that more often than we do.

You might be great at that, but I am not. God has tasked each of us with the job of blessing those who are in our lives either for a moment or for years. We make God's love manifest by how we treat others. But over the years God has taught me that the reasons I give myself for just sitting in my office and saying nothing are nonsense. Much of the Christian walk is to notice, realize how we are responding and then share what we see in an appropriate way with others.

The young mother smiled and said that it was even more fun to blow bubbles for her children than it has been to chase them as a child. You see, her mom blew bubbles for her and her brother 25 years ago. I watched as she remembered and smiled from within. Do you understand what I mean by seeing another "smile from within?" Those smiles gently burst onto their face and eyes in a way that also draws love from our hearts as we watch. The moment was sweet in the doing and in the remembering and in the shared understanding.

She said she wished her mom could join her but unfortunately she had died in an auto accident a few years ago. Then she added, "I think she is here, though. I can feel her" and she smiled again. I think she is right, by the way.

A simple scene. A young mother blowing bubbles for her bouncing children on a great spring day behind the church. Sometimes all we have to do is to allow ourselves to really see what we are seeing, get out of our chair, take a short walk and say a few simple words like, "I was watching your children hopping around after bubbles." If we are quiet, we can see our God at work uniting a young woman to her mother. Somehow together they bring joy into her children's life. And if we join the scene with respect, God includes us in the blessing. Such moments are what the Bible calls holy. The blessing we share is from living the gift of life as God intends us to live it.



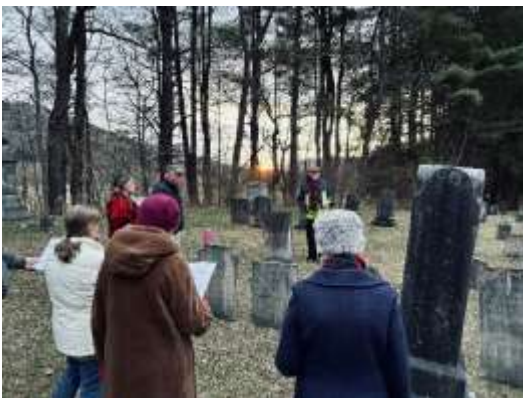

## Apportionment



The **Per Capita amount for 2024** has been set at **\$45.90 per member**. Per Capita apportionment is based on church membership as of December 31, 2022. Our apportionment is based on 151 members giving a total of \$6,930.90. The money is paid by our church to cover our share of basic operation costs of our Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly. Each member is invited to contribute \$45.90 to help pay this obligation.
