

We are on a good path. We have visitors. We have new members. Our church school is growing. Giving from living donors is up. The Kirk revenues are up. Worship attendance is strong. Manse repairs are proceeding. Church maintenance is coming along. Our mission program is growing. After years of having less each fall, this fall we are stronger. We are on a good path.

What have you learned from the last 18 months together? I have learned again that God is faithful. I confess that when I came I had no real idea as to where to start helping you be ready for your next pastor. There was so much to do. Then I recalled something Corrie Ten Boom said:

"Never be afraid to trust an unknown future to a known God."

When I just cannot see the future, I fall back on what I know to be true. I know that Jesus is right. No surprise there. Jesus said, take it one day at a time, one challenge at a time, one hill at a time. Keep on doing the next right thing. Just start. Eventually, you will see that tomorrow is not only possible, but promising.

Have you experienced the truth of the same promise? We take steps and then consider what has happened, then look around and Jesus meets us at the next opportunity to step forward. That is true both individually and as a church.

God is more than faithful. God is clever. When we are on a good path, we are also learning that we had solutions staring at us that we just did not see. We had talents we did not know how to use. We had the resources we needed or the contacts to find them. In time it "all comes together," as they say.

God is clever. The mysterious "it" that can come together for us is happening, and it is very nice. Am I making sense? The next time there is a fallen tree across your path, I hope you remember this time in our walk together in life. We worked together. We sought God's leadership. God shows us a path one step at a time, Jesus helped us clear the way. So let's walk on it and be glad.

One last thing to remember. You know each other well—and you are a trustworthy bunch. That is a mark that the Holy Spirit is with you. God is reliable and those who know God become reliable also. Jesus once said:

"Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much." Luke 16:10 NIV

God is at work among you in a remarkable way. One day at a time. One step at a time. You are on a good path. Enjoy the walk.

# ANNUAL COMMUNITY THANKSGIVING DINNER



### Mission

#### **YVA DONATIONS**



On Tuesday, September 17th the Kirk Thrift Shoppe made a donation of 32 boxes filled with housewares, toys and clothing to "Vietnam Veterans of America". On October 7th we donated 26 boxes. The VVA picks up filled containers every Tuesday and saves our volunteers from having to transport unsaleable items to the landfill. We will continue making these donations every few weeks. The Kirk is very grateful for the generous donations left in the tubs every day and our volunteers are especially happy to be supporting those in need.

#### **CHRISTMAS STOCKING MISSION**

Christmas stocking collection will occur at church on Sunday December 1, 8, 15, 22 and 29, 2024. The dimes collected in the Christmas stockings will be distributed between Habitat for Humanity and Helios Care for use in our local communities. **Christmas Stockings** are still available in baskets throughout the church. You may also drop off your stockings in the office during normal office hours.

#### HIRRICANE RELIEF

In the wake of Hurricane Helene, we gave a \$1,000 donation, in addition to \$2,060 raised through Kirk sales, to help with recovery in North Carolina. Helene has been described as the "deadliest and most damaging storm ever to hit North Carolina," causing catastrophic flooding and destruction across the western part of the state.



### Rev. Dr. Robert W. Barrett Sr.



Rev. Dr. Robert Warren Barrett Sr., 81, of Urbana, Illinois, passed away at Accolade Health Care of Savoy, Illinois, on Monday, October 7th, 2024.

Bob was born in Washington, D.C. on January 30, 1943, the son of Robert Richard and Ruth Stephen Barrett. He married Melody Kay Liskow on July 1, 1967, at St. Michael's Lutheran Church in Little Valley, New York. She survives.

He is also survived by his sons, Robert Jr. (Anna) of Urbana, Illinois, and Andrew (Claudia) of Falls Church, Virginia, and by his grandchildren, Frances and Arthur Ivy-Barrett of Urbana and Jack and Holly Barrett of Falls Church.

Bob graduated from Hamburg High School in Hamburg, New York, in 1961 and received a B.A. in history from Hanover College, Indiana, where he was a member of the Lambda Chi Alpha fraternity. He graduated from McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago,

Illinois, in 1969 with a Master of Divinity degree and later earned his Doctor of Ministry degree from the same institution in 1981. He was ordained by the Presbytery of Western New York (Presbyterian Church USA) on June 15, 1969, at the First Presbyterian Church in Ellicottville, New York, and served there from 1969-72. The other churches he ministered at were Northminster Presbyterian, Endwell, New York (1972-79); First Presbyterian, Delhi, New York (1979-93); and Tuskawilla Presbyterian, Oviedo, Florida (1993-2006). After he honorably retired in 2006, he served as parish associate at Winter Park Presbyterian, Winter Park, Florida (2006-08). Bob held multiple leadership positions in the Presbyteries of Susquehanna Valley (where he was both Moderator and Stated Clerk) and Central Florida.

His community service included serving on the Village Board in Ellicottville; the Lions Club (president) in Ellicottville; the Lions Club in Binghamton, New York; and the Kiwanis Club (president) in Delhi. Bob was also chaplain at the New York State Youth Camp in Great Valley, New York, and at the Broome County Jail in Binghamton. He was a member of the 4-H Board in Ellicottville and the Broome County Drug Board in Binghamton. He also was a Cubmaster for the Boy Scouts of America in Endwell.

A memorial service will be held at a later date. Burial will be in the Little Valley Rural Cemetery, Little Valley. In lieu of flowers, memorials may be given to any of the churches where he ministered.
