PNC Progress Report

Since April 1st the PNC committee has held 10 meetings to review and discuss candidate referrals and conduct interviews, as well as learn about changes to Presbytery health insurance requirements and review some of our contract documents in preparation for when we are at the point of extending a call.

By the end of June we will have a total of 3 candidate visits "under our belt." During these visits the candidates have an opportunity to tour the church, the local area and the manse as they get acquainted with us on a more informal and personal basis. But before inviting candidates, we conduct online interviews with them and subsequent reference checks if we feel we want to continue the conversation. Thanks to technology we are able to observe them and hear their message through their recorded sermons.

Since January 1st, 9 interviews have been held (8 since April 1st). Some of these interviews were first and second interviews with the same individual to delve more deeply into questions we or they may have. We have posted a job listing with Princeton Seminary and prepared a video tour of the manse for interested candidates to view. These are things we are learning along the way that may assist in our search.

The PNC Committee is grateful for your continued prayers, the assistance of Darcy Gibson in preparing materials and sending virtual links for meetings, Pastor Jamie and Bessie for their flexibility and grace in allowing the PNC to provide manse tours, and for Greg Garis and Mark Montfort for their support and guidance as our Presbytery and COM liaisons. We are encouraged by the recent candidates we have been speaking with and as Mark and Greg keep reminding us, there is the perfect Pastor for our church out there and we have to trust God to lead the right one to us.



It is Summer and at last the temperature would agree. I have been thinking about what really counts in life. I bet you do as well sometimes. I was struck by two different people I visited a couple of weeks ago, both treasured members of churches I served in the past. Both are in their mid-nineties. Both have been involved in the church for many, many years. Both have heard most of the same sermons since they are regular attendees at the same church.

One of these people is cheerful and bright. She begins her day with a simple prayer. "Lord, who do you want me to love today." She has prayed that prayer daily for over 70 years. She learned to pray that way years ago from one of her church's pastors. In those days she was a young married, having children and supporting her husband as he began his new career. "Busy, Busy," she said as she was reminiscing with me. I am 12 years her junior so she busts my chops by calling me "Kid" and "Young Man."

I asked her what difference praying that prayer made after 70 years. "Oh, it reminds me to put aside my own sorrow, Pastor Jamie. You see I have lost a lot of people in my life. If I were to have a high school reunion it would be me. There were just over 40 people in my class, but I am the only one still living. And I have lost one of my three children, my spouse and my parents and all my age mates. I do have several friends in their 80's, but most of them are in bad health. So by praying this way God reminds me daily to love who I can. My life is not up. They count. The God that loves me loves them. I get to do the same. If I did not pray this way and follow God's lead in loving others, I am afraid I would just be sad. I know people who get that way. And Lord only knows I don't have the energy I once did. But thinking of ways to love the people God puts on my heart keeps me going. God can take me any time. I'm OK with that. But God also continues to bring people into my life, people I laugh with and people I cry with. But it is all living and that is what God asks of me. God asks me to live each day."

The other person is polite, quite pleasant to be with but you can feel the sorrow just below the surface. I asked her what she had done recently that was interesting. "I went to my husband's grave with flowers on his birthday. He loved roses." Then she looked at me and said, "Jamie, I just want to go see him again. I'm done here. Why doesn't God just take me."

I suggested she pray, "Lord, I know you have people for me to love today, so please show me who."

"Oh, no," she said, "they are not as important to me as my husband."

"They are to God," I said hopefully.

"Well, God will just have to find someone else."

I smiled and changed the subject. My mother used to say, "You can lead a horse to water, but you cannot make them drink." She was not drinking today.

I visited these two older friends the other day. One was happy and full of life. The other was flat and waiting for death. The contrast made me think. What do I want? Now perhaps you are wondering about what you want.

You don't have to be old to make the decision, "What counts to me: Loving those God loves and loving those who are important to me." It is not obvious to us when we are 10 or 20, but along the way our losses start adding up. Eventually the answer you give to the question "What counts?" will shape your life each day. Choose God's service and you will never run out of challenge and joy.

Fixer-Uppers

Summer is peak time for home renovations and remodeling projects. Those can be super stressful, starting with the selection of a contractor.



In a blog about her own family's construction plans, Laura Elliott

explains the challenge: "It's not just any builder I want. I want one who has impeccable workmanship, is completely trustworthy and delivers our long-awaited [projects] early and under-budget." After sifting through bids and reviews, she discovered that most builders "look like they do pretty similar work for a pretty similar price."

For spiritual renovations, however, the choice is clear. "God is the builder of everything," says Hebrews 3:4 (NIV). Elliott writes, "Jesus is not only the *builder* of His Father's house, but He is the *buyer*, and the *heir* as well." And what he's building, she adds, is "a better Bride," his church.

Faith upgrades are an ongoing, lifelong process. "The renewal of our natures is a work of great importance," said 18th-century minister George Whitefield. "It is not to be done in a day. We have not only a new house to build up, but an old one to pull down." It's a good thing God oversees this project!
