

PNC Progress Report

After a dry spell of receiving no candidates and recognizing the current competitiveness in the market for solo pastors, the PNC requested and received approval from Session for increasing the minimum and maximum effective salaries in the CLC matching system. This was approved by Committee on Ministry (COM) and the information was then updated in our CLC matching system.

After increasing the minimum and maximum effective salaries we did receive 2 new matches in October that have been invited to apply.

In September and October, the PNC had two interviews with one candidate and completed reference checks. However, this candidate withdrew after a period of discernment.

Please continue to pray for the work of the PNC and ask God to open the way for a Pastor to be led to our church.

sponsored by the Delhi Area Clergy Association will be held at 4:00 pm on Sunday, November 23rd here at First Presbyterian Church.


ANNUAL COMMUNITY THANKSGIVING DINNER

Details about the dinner will be announced as they become available, but please plan to contribute food items and perhaps volunteer some time to help do our part in facilitating this tradition of local outreach.



Thankful Thoughts

"The worst moment for the atheist is when he is really thankful and has nobody to thank." That quote from 19th-century painter Daniel Rossetti is often misattributed to Christian apologist G.K. Chesterton. In fact, Chesterton springboarded off Rossetti's statement to elaborate on thankfulness.

"The converse of this proposition is also true," said Chesterton, "and it is certain that this gratitude produced ... the most purely joyful moments that have been known to man. [Rossetti] boasted that he mixed all his colors with brains, and the great saint may be said to mix all his thoughts with thanks."
