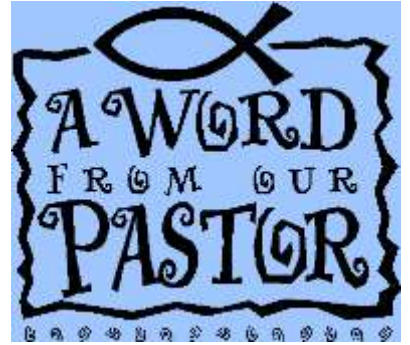

# Apportionment



The **Per Capita amount for 2026** has been set at **\$50.51 per member**. Per Capita apportionment is based on church membership as of December 31, 2024. Our apportionment is based on 122 members giving a total of \$6,162.22. The money is paid by our church to cover our share of basic operation costs of our Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly. Each member is invited to contribute \$50.51 to help pay this obligation.

# *PNC Progress Report*

We have been searching for a Pastor for over two years and felt we needed to provide some insight into what the PNC has encountered during our search process. As explained in our previous reports to the congregation, the Presbytery has utilized a newly created system of finding candidates called the PCUSA Church Leadership Connection. This system is used to match ministers seeking a call with churches seeking Pastors. But as of 10/4/24 there have been 139 matches of which 96 were declined or never responded to our invitation, and 43 were either not considered by us or withdrew from consideration. A total of 23 interviews were conducted by the PNC. So, you can see that while your PNC has been working hard, we have struggled to find the right match.

We have tried advertising in Presbyterian Publications, created marketing tools such as a video and brochure about our church, reached out to several seminaries, requested and received approval from session and COM to increase our minimum and maximum effective salaries, sought collaboration with the Bovina Presbyterian church by arranging for a joint meeting with their PNC and Session with our PNC and Session. Along the way we have sought advice and guidance from our Presbytery contacts.

At one point when we had not received many candidates from the CLC, we reached out to them. Rev. Manuel D. Silva-Esterrich, Manager of Call Process shared that the system doesn't work well for small rural churches.

As the CLC system isn't working well for the size and location of our church, are currently working on the ability to share an advertisement for our Solo Pastor position in social media. We hope that you will be willing and able to share the ad on your social media accounts to help spread the word. The congregation will be notified when the ad will be available and how to share it soon.

More details about our search efforts will be available in the 2026 Annual Report. As always, please keep the PNC in your prayers and know we welcome your thoughts and suggestions for finding a Pastor for our church.

# **Trustee Meeting Highlights November - December 2025**

- Regular FPC bills for November and December have been reviewed, approved and paid.
- Trustees have replaced refrigerator, stove and dishwasher with new appliances in the manse. Trustees, Pastor Jamie, Bessie and Church members have done many maintenance items in manse. Trustees also replaced the garage door.
- Electrical work was added in fellowship hall and electrical upgrades were made to electric panels in Church as well, which was needed for insurance purposes.
- Trustees are volunteering their time to keep sidewalks shoveled and sanded. Cullen LaFever, Rusty Maxwell and Cantwells are volunteering plowing/sanding the parking lot. If anyone else can help please let Trustees know! Looks like a lot of snow this winter!
- Trustees ordered new camera and speakers for sanctuary (there is some grant money left to use up). This will help livestream and sound to pulpit and choir loft.
- Elections were held for officers for 2026 which remain basically the same: President - Tom Little, Vice-President - Tom Leo and Secretary - Kathy Beveridge.
- We are still looking for people to train on the livestream, which pays \$30 for about hour and half on Sunday. Whatever time you can give to Church for this will be appreciated! Let Darcy know if interested.

## **Bible Study Continued!**

We just finished a 12-week study (in 10 weeks to finish out the year) and loved the first book in the series titled "Sensible Shoes, A Story About the Spiritual Journey," by Sharon Garlough Brown. We used the study guide and journaling and the scripture readings at each of our sessions. We meet every Monday from 4-5:30pm. This small group study is best for around 12 participants, but we can always break out into two groups if we get a lot more participants.

The next book in series is titled "Two Steps Forward," which we are excited to read. We'd like to invite women to join us April 7<sup>th</sup> for this next study! We ask that you read the first book before April so you get to know the characters that will be continuing in next book.
