

How far is the east from the west? The Lord has taken our sins further away than that! He no longer says that we are guilty. (Psalm 103: 12 EASY Translation)

As we move on towards Easter, we travel through Lent, a time to ponder the nature and damage of sin.

For Freedom Christ Has Set Us Free.

We are set free from endless repeating of the same thoughts and actions that cause us and those around us harm. Jesus came to set you and me free to rejoice in the beauty of our lives, the company of others and the joy of blessing.

Sin is rooted in believing things about ourselves, others or God that are not true. When our view of the world is twisted, so are our actions. Without realizing it, we are aimed in the wrong direction. Jesus came to change us by freeing us to see what is. Once again, God's wisdom is the ability to see with our eyes, hear with our ears and understand what is seen and heard in our hearts.

I was talking to an 87-year-old woman I know in another church who said to me, "People make me nervous. I am sure they will think I am a foolish old woman with bad ears if I ask them what they mean or what they want. So I make it up, fill in the gaps with my own guesses. I often get their motives wrong or think they want things they don't."

I asked her how she came to find freedom from living in her made up world. She said, "I cannot love like Jesus loves until I know who I live with."

Wow. So simple. The gospel of Jesus Christ is so simple. It takes courage to ask. If we follow the example of Christ, we can do a pretty good job. Any of us can see the person in front of us. We can hear what they mean and not what we imagine they mean. We can understand the person next to us. But we have to have the courage to ask and a readiness to hear.

My friend went on to say, "Now when I started understanding who I was with, I was very embarrassed. I was ashamed of myself for the mistakes I had made for years because I made it up rather than ask. Then one day as I was feeling bad, I came across that passage in the Bible about how God takes our guilt away. If God has taken my shame away, who am I the haul it back again?"

One day, several of the disciples suddenly saw something new about Jesus. They fell to the ground in awe and shame. Jesus reached down and pulled them up. He wanted them to stand with him as upright men and women. He wants the same for you and for me. If you let him, he will take your shame away. Instead, we are free to feel gratitude. If you are feeling guilty about your past or are ashamed of being yourself, my prayer for you this Lent is that you allow Jesus to lift you up and be free from the guilt of past sins you have given up.

PNC Progress Report

The PNC continues to meet weekly. Since January there have been 3 additional candidates interviewed with more to come. In addition, we have created accounts and posted the position on 4 seminary websites.

At the Annual Meeting on 2/15/26 we shared information about an advertisement for our Solo Pastor position. 

Bible Study Book Series



Mission

One Great Hour of Sharing

During the month of March our church mission focus will be One Great Hour of Sharing which is a PCUSA mission. Join with Presbyterians worldwide in sharing God's love with our neighbors-in-need around the world by providing relief from natural disasters, food for the hungry, and support for the poor and oppressed. This Lenten season, please give generously to One Great Hour of Sharing.

The Mission Committee, with the Session's approval, has set a Lenten goal of taking up the cause of sending a "wound care" crate to Ukraine. Crates for Ukraine is a program that collects supplies, packs the crates and ships them to the Ukrainian Presbyterian Church. Our goal is to raise \$2,500 through designated Mission giving. Your contribution will be matched by The Kirk for a total of \$5,000, the cost of one wound care crate.

April is Church World Service Kits collection month. Several years ago we collected only blankets, but recently we have collected hygiene kits. Supplies needed for each kit are:

- **1 washcloth**
- 1 fingernail or toenail clipper (either is acceptable – remove from package)
- 1 bath-size bar of soap in original package
- 1 toothbrush in original package
- **1 travel-size deodorant stick** (3.4 ounces or less, non-aerosol)
- **1 travel-size body lotion** (3.4 ounces or less, fragrance free)
- **1 travel-size shampoo** (3.4 ounces or less)
- 1 travel-size toothpaste (3.4 ounces or less, expiration date at least one year away)
- **1 sturdy wide-tooth comb** (removed from package, must have at least 6 inches of teeth. Pocket combs or picks not acceptable. Rattail combs and combs without handles are acceptable.)

*Left from last year I have a large supply of nail clippers, bath soap, toothbrushes and toothpaste. I need **washcloths, deodorant, body lotion, combs and shampoo**. I understand buying online these items are much cheaper. CWS requests a \$2.00 processing fee per kit, which the Mission committee helps pay for.*

Besides hygiene kits, CWS collects period packs (menstrual hygiene supplies that support health, comfort and confidence), school and art supplies, and clean-up buckets. Anyone interested in assembling the last three kits, see Betty or Darcy for a list of items needed. If you have any questions regarding the kits, ask Betty Bell.

January - February 2026

- Regular FPC bills for January-February have been reviewed, approved and paid. Wickham fund moved from CD to investments for better yields.
- Electrical work now complete, will update insurance company.
- Trustees ordered new camera and speakers for sanctuary (there is some grant money left to use up). This will help livestream and sound to pulpit and choir loft.
- Furnace motor that heats sanctuary was replaced by Wayne Snyder.
- Snow removal has kept trustees busy, if anyone wants to help please let a trustee know!
- We are still looking for people to train on the livestream which pays \$30 for about hour and half on Sunday. Whatever time can give to Church for this will be appreciated! Let Darcy know if interested.

Apportionment



The **Per Capita amount for 2026** has been set at **\$50.51 per member**. Per Capita apportionment is based on church membership as of December 31, 2024. Our apportionment is based on 122 members giving a total of \$6,162.22. The money is paid by our church to cover our share of basic operation costs of our Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly. Each member is invited to contribute \$50.51 to help pay this obligation.
