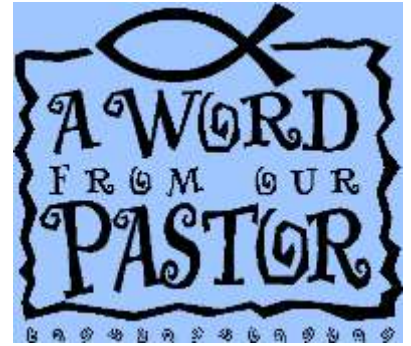

Early the next morning Laban kissed his grandchildren and his daughters and blessed them. Then he left and returned home. (Genesis 31:55)

As spring returns and the sun asserts itself over the cold and the mud, trees begin to bloom and the green appears - so beautiful. I love winter, personally (I hear groans). Winter is not my forever season, though. Spring is. New life. Greater freedom. Hello sidewalks and short sleeved shirts. Spring feels like coming home in the universe to me. How about you? Is there a welcome in the air for you? However you experience it, Spring is amazing.

Like I said, there is a sense in which Spring is like God's voice whispering in our hearts, "Welcome home, my beloved. Look around and rejoice at the wonder of it all."

One of the sweetest stories in the Bible is about how Jacob and Laban are reconciled. Laban had tricked Jacob into marrying his oldest daughter, Leah. She is called "Leah of the weak eyes" in the Bible. I am not sure why, but I am sure that is not a good thing. Jacob loved Rachael and eventually married her as well. And both had children. The sheep Jacob tended were strong and vigorous and his flock prospered. Because of what Jacob did, his father-in-law Laban ceased being comfortably well-off. He became rich. His sons became jealous of Jacob. They caused trouble in the family.

Trouble in the family. No one's favorite thing. It is like an ingrown toenail. At best it does not hurt too much. But it is often much worse than that. And it does not get better until fixed. And that is exactly what happened. The family relationships kept on getting worse and worse. In the end God fixed it.

It got to the point that Jacob went to his two wives. They agreed. Laban's household was no longer home for them. So they ran away. Except, when you have several hundred sheep and a dozen camels you cannot exactly hide. You leave a trail. And Laban with his furious sons came after them. They caught up with them in Galilee. But the night before Laban was going to confront Jacob and "fix his little red wagon" as the expression goes, God appeared to Laban in a dream.

The next morning Laban made an agreement with Jacob to honor him and allow him to continue his life without interfering. Peace returned to the family.

And this is the last scene in the story. "Laban kissed his grandchildren and his daughters and blessed them. Then he left and returned home."

I don't think we are told what the season was, but the usual time for moving a flock is late spring. The ewes have had their lambs and their lambs are able to eat grass and move distances. Summer in the middle east brings heat and the grass burns up. You want to be home before that happens.

Return home. What has that meant in your life? How can you celebrate home? Is there anyone in your family that needs you to wrap your arms around them and bless them and wish them well as they return to their home? It's Spring. Time to be home.

PNC Progress Report

Since our last report in the March/April Courier the following candidates were matched in the CLC system: 9 Candidates were matched: of those, 8 were invited to apply, 4 declined our invitation, 1 was not considered, 1 we are awaiting a response to our invitation, 1 remains in conversation with us and 1 has an interview scheduled in May. With the Lenten/Easter season it seems the candidate applications have slowed. But hopefully that will pick up soon.

We have had conversations with our Lead Presbyter, Greg Garis and were provided additional information to help us in our search. The Presbytery has subscribed to another service for help in finding candidates outside the CLC system. The system is called the Great Lakes Call Finder. Our solo pastor position is now posted on their website.

Greg stated that he would be emailing the leaders in the Albany and Hudson Valley Presbyteries to advertise our position. He will also connect with the people in the CLC system to see how to more effectively reach candidates interested in rural areas. And when he goes to Synod in April, he will be asking other Presbyteries what they are doing to get pastors into rural churches.

We reviewed our Ministry Discernment Profile and made updates to some of the areas that have changed in the past 2 years to ensure our profile is up to date.

We thank those of you that have come forward with suggestions and ideas. As a result of one conversation, we have reached out to Delaware County Economic Development to provide us with current information that would be pertinent for interested candidates such as the economic, business, and demographics of our area.

As we continue this journey please keep us in your prayers. Continue to spread the word about our wonderful church and let people know about our pastoral position.
